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Minutes of the Nordic Meeting the fifteenth of november 1975.

Members present: Finland: Timo Nieminen, Eero Kausalainen.
Sweden: Åke Almgreen.
Norway: Eilif Ness, Helge Sandness.
Denmark: Svend Brøsted, Niels Holten-Lund.

- Finland: There are about 500 members. The number of jumps are rising and there have not been any accidents. They have got a permanent employed instructor. They plan W.M. in "para-ski".

Norway: There are about 800 members, half of whom are active. More people have been doing R.W. whilst precision has not been of such great interest.

Sweden: There are about 1200 members and the numbers are increasing. About half of the clubs have their own planes. There has been one accidental death. R.W. is concentrated in two areas around Stockholm and Gothenburg.

Denmark: There are about 1000 members and the numbers are increasing well. There are many who are working with R.W., but increase is slight instyle.
- The Nordic R.W. championship will take place in Uti. There will be a 10-man aeroplane present. Norway thinks it is too expensive to send both a 10-man team and a 4-man team and that the winner would therefore come from the richest country. The other countries are agreeing that competitions help to train more and in that way achieve better results. The date for the championship depends upon the military championships, but it will most likely be between the seventh and the fifteenth of august 1976.

3. Sweden thinks that the Nordic records are good, but to insure smooth running one country ought to be in charge of registration arrangements. Norway thinks that there ought to be official records that there otherwise will surely occur unofficial ones. Denmark thinks that there should be central registration, but the approval ought to be national. If the records can be approved nationally they can be approved as Nordic records also. To have something to start with the existing national records should be sent in and the best ones approved as Nordic records. Denmark keeps the register. There can be made records in the following disciplines:
- 1 man accuracy
 - 4 man accuracy
 - 1 man style 3 series
 - 4 man RW solo figure
 - 10 man speedstar
 - biggest star
 - highest jump.
4. A Nordic "para-ski" competition ought to be held according to rules that are as close to international rules as possible. It should be based both on parachute jumps and skiruns, so the winner needs to be good at both. The first time the competitions should be held as a CUP after the rules Sweden has made. "Østersund Parachuteclub" can arrange it for 1977.
5. Next WPC lasts for 3 weeks during September-October 76 in Italy. Norway sends a full team with a judge and a trainee judge. Sweden and Denmark send a full team with a judge. Finland sends a full team.

6. Danish championship in week 28

7. Norway thinks that the rules should not be changed for W.M. 1977, but the number of figures in R.W. for 4 and 10 men should be increased from 6 to 10.
Denmark thinks that Sporting-Code for 4 man RW records should be changed. 6 to 10.
When a malfunction occurs the rules for a re-jump should be changed so one can get an extra jump in more cases.
In stead of the championship leader the chief judge shall decide when they can jump and what jump they have to do.
Sweden agrees with the proposals regarding RW and malfunctions. But they think the work between the chief judge and the championship leader is OK and that it can be difficult to write down.
Norway thinks there should be a training program for trainee-judges at competitions.
All are sceptical about a European Committee unless they shall only coordinate competitions. Everyone approved that the USSR proposes parachute jumps in OL.

8. Norway, Sweden and Denmark think it is a good idea to send an instructor to Iceland. Finland would not commit themselves as they have no money for it. We can share the travel expenses and Iceland can pay the boarding. We will write to Iceland for more information.

9. Next meeting will be held in Stockholm in October-November 1976.
